







**The Tomb is **Still** Empty**

out to visit the tomb.




**Christ's Promises Are

For all of God's promises have been fulfilled in Christ with a resounding "Yes!" And through Christ, our "Amen" (which means "Yes") ascends to God for his glory.






It is God who enables us, along








“So let everyone in Israel know for certain that God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, to be both Lord and Messiah!”
